New this year! Not just for sewers! There is more to fashion than just sewing. We have a new option for garments created by you, by any means – knitting/crocheting, tie dyed, ironed-on or otherwise embellished clothing, or even clothing that has been altered to re-size it or make it something new. If you can wear it, you can model it! This event is all about how fashion fits you and your presentation and poise. Add your flair to purchased outfits to create a new look too!

Description of Lots:

- **Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for self** examples include knitting/crocheting, tie-dye, Cricut designs, etc. or an altered article of clothing. Complete your outfit with items that complete the look, including accessories as you see fit. Garment will be judged based on choice of materials, how the garment enhances his/her personal body type, sense of style, and meets the need of the wearer. Also be able to explain how your creation was made, materials used, what it looked like before, etc. wearer.
- Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for another person examples include knitting/crocheting, tiedye, Cricut designs, etc. or an altered article of clothing. Complete your outfit with items that complete the look, including accessories as you see fit. Garment will be judged based on choice of materials, how the garment enhances his/her personal body type, sense of style, and meets the need of the wearer. Also be able to explain how your creation was made, materials used, what it looked like before, etc.
- **Buy and Show** "Thrift it Up" with garments pieced together using pre-owned or new clothing to complete an outfit. Bring a complete outfit from home that will be judged on fit, accessories, and wardrobe compatibility. Be able to explain how it fits into your existing wardrobe, answer questions about cost, where purchased, the style you are hoping to achieve, etc.

Class C: Grades K-2

- 1. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for self
- 2. Buy and Show

Class D: Grades 3-5

- 1. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for self
- 2. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for another person
- 3. Buy and Show

Class E: Grades 6-8

- 1. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for self
- 2. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for another person
- 3. Buy and Show

Class F: Grades 9-13

- 1. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for self
- 2. Garment sewn/created by exhibitor, for another person
- 3. Buy and Show

Rules:

- This event is open to all youth in grades K-13. Youth are allowed to enter one item per class according to grade category. To receive fair premiums (grades 4-13) you must register through Fair Entry prior to this event. Use the Clothing Revue classes under department 26J.
 - a. Grades K-2 entries are for participation ribbon only. All younger members will be judged together. This does not count as one of their 4 projects for the fair.
 - b. Grade 3 will receive a placed ribbon. This does not count as one of their 6 projects for the fair.
- 2. Any items created by the exhibitor are also eligible to exhibit at the fair, where it will be judged on construction and techniques used rather than the appearance of outfit/garment and modelers presentation and poise. Item must be entered according to standard fair rules, prior to this event to qualify for exhibit at the fair. Use the appropriate department and class for your item.
- 3. All judging is conference style. Judging criteria is listed in each category description.
- 4. Individuals who exhibit at the Fashion Revue will be photographed and included on a poster to be displayed at the fair. There will not be a Style Revue at the fair. If item has not been entered as a fair exhibit, there is no need to bring to the fair.
- 5. Write a descriptive paragraph about your garment to be included in the poster displayed at the fair. Include information such as main technique used (sewing, knitting, dyed, etc.), fiber content/main materials used, intended use, general cost, special features, and accessories used. Be sure to use your name, youth organization and any other important information in this paragraph. Write it in the third person. Write a separate paragraph for each class entered. Be sure to bring a copy of your paragraph to Clothing Revue or email to <u>djbudtke@yahoo.com</u>.
