Re-enrollment Opens September 1

- All youth and adult volunteers must re-enroll in 4-H annually!
- 4HOnline will open for re-enrollment on TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5th.
- All youth members must re-enroll by November 1 to be eligible to exhibit at the 2025 Creative Arts Day.

Why Should I Re-enroll Early?

Once you complete your re-enrollment:

- Members & leaders can register for events (like Fall Forum)
- Club leaders have an accurate roster
- Families will get project or grade specific information
- Volunteers have liability coverage 4-H programs & activities will have up-to-date health information
- You will receive county and statewide 4-H communications

CONGRATULATIONS 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAMS

June 23- 28, 2024 was an exciting week for members of the Wisconsin 4-H Shooting Sports teams attending the National Championships at Grand Island, Nebraska. Since 2009 Wisconsin 4-H has sent teams of top shooting sports competitors to the National Championships. Recently 12 team members and five team coaches comprised the discipline teams of Air Pistol, Air Rifle, Archery Compound, Archery Recurve, and Shotgun. Over 40 states and some 500 4-H members participated in three days of competition hosted by Nebraska 4-H and the University of Nebraska – Lincoln.

Ryan Kundinger from Richfield 4-H competed in Air Pistol and Mallory Cepress, also from Richfield 4-H, competed in Recurve Archery. Tammy Grassel served as the Recurve Archery coach. To achieve a national team placing, Ryan and Mallory participated in several of the 15 annual invitational 4-H Shooting Sports events offered around Wisconsin. Scores from these events establish an individual's eligibility ranking for next year's National Championships.

Wisconsin's Air Pistol team crossed the stage this year - taking 2nd place in the Rapid Fire competition, 6th place in Slow Fire, and 5th place Overall among 18 teams.

Congratulations Ryan and Mallory for making a national team, an accomplishment that requires hours of practice. Thank you to the 4-H leaders for their shooting sports commitment so 4-H members may have the opportunity for positive growth experiences at all levels.
