

Science by the River 2024

Planning is well under way for the fourth annual Science by the River event. Science by the River will be held on **Saturday October 5, 2024 from 11 am to 2 pm.**



Science by the River is a celebration of all things science and outdoors! This free, one-day event gives attendees of all ages an opportunity to connect to the Wisconsin River and science in our community. Science by the River is being hosted by multiple community organizations including UW-Extension Wood County and Clean Green Action and is made possible through a grant from the Incourage Community Foundation.

Discover stations will be set up along the walking path from Ben Hansen Park to the Wisconsin Rapids downtown Farmer's Market. Each station will showcase different aspects of science through information, demonstrations, and hands on learning opportunities!

We are currently recruiting discovery station hosts for the event. Discovery station hosts should have a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and/or Math) focus and passion for sharing their work with kids and adults alike. Currently registered station hosts include the Sandhill Wildlife area that will have furs that participants can explore, Bird City Wisconsin Rapids will have a handson activity for kids to build insect habitats, the Center for Watershed Science and Education will have a groundwater model that participants can explore as well as free nitrate screenings for private well owners, Petenwell and Castle Rock Stewards and the Wisconsin Forestry Center.

Families and residents of all ages are encouraged to attend this fun event. Those that visit discovery stations throughout the day will have the opportunity to earn a prize! Science by the River will be held rain or shine this year, with a rain location of the Wisconsin Rapids East Junior High.
